100+ Year Old Schoolhouse Renovation

Our clients were in desperate need of more space since their family had recently grown.

Their home was actually a former one-room schoolhouse which had been transformed into a two-bedroom, one bath house. The property itself was over 100 years old, and the interior walls and ceilings were added in the 1920s.

Their master bedroom was so small that there was not



enough room for a bedside table, and there was only one closet in the entire home! Our clients wanted to add on to the house but weren't sure how to do so without having to walk through a bedroom to get to the new area.

That's where our work started.

We opened up the floor plan to improve the traffic flow. The small master bedroom became a family room, leading to the new addition.

Remodeling? Consider Incorporating Home Security

We also added a home office, a laundry room, a nursery for our client's sweet little baby and created a master suite. In the master bath, we created an elegant shower with a marble baroque mosaic niche to allow space for toiletries. To make the new master addition cohesive, we installed Kempas hardwood flooring throughout the space.

It was important to our clients that we maintained the character of the home. The new addition blends perfectly into the existing home so that it is impossible to tell where the old meets the new.

We added stucco to the exterior of the new addition to perfectly match the paint color and integrate it with the original stucco facade. We also made sure to keep details like the crown molding and door trim consistent throughout the new addition.
