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we were pleased to find the area looked much more open than before, which gave us plenty of room to work with.

What We Installed

We installed a 5'x7' EP Henry Coventry landing with steps and black Westbury railing to create the new space. The new railing makes the space look much more modern and on-trend than the old white railing did.

We also installed approximately 546 square feet EP Henry Bristol Chiseled Stone Paver Patio in Blue Slate and a 2'x14' EP Coventry 2-sided Cast Stone Seating Wall in Adirondack.

The finishing touch to the project was the addition of a firepit. We installed a 3' EP Henry Coventry Cast Stone Fire Pit and Adirondack.

The new space looks clean and wide open. It's the perfect spot to have an end-of-summer get-together or a bonfire in the cool autumn months.
