PROJECT REVIEW: **Kitchen & Sunroom Renovation**

We recently completed a kitchen renovation and sunroom addition for some clients. The end result turned out great and added a nice update to their home.

Let's take a look at the project:

Kitchen Renovation


The kitchen has a modern, abstract vibe which features a sleek chimney-style wall hood and a fun multi-colored tile backsplash.

For flooring, we installed rectangular ceramic tile in Liguria Pearl Porcelain in matte, which nicely complements the MSI Silver Cloud Granite countertops as well as the backsplash and cabinet color.

The backsplash has patterned tiles using Imperial Ivory Matte with Ivory High Pencil Liner edging. We also included a backsplash accent in Imperial Gris Gloss and Imperial Pewter. Keeping the gray color scheme going, we painted the Jim Bishop Cabinets in North Andover in Antique Paint and Driftwood.

The kitchen also features an Allora large single bowl under-mount Sink, a Kitchen Aid 24" dishwasher, a Zephyr Anzio

Fixtures


Plain white fixtures and cheap chrome faucets usually come standard in new homes. Unfortunately, they stick out like a sore thumb and ruins any design attempts you make.

wall mount chimney hood, low profile pyramid canopy, and a Kohler Sous Pro-Style Single-Handle Pull-Down Sprayer Kitchen Faucet in Vibrant Stainless.

Sunroom

Our clients also wanted an open and airy room where they could relax on a quiet afternoon. One of the most important aspects of any sunroom is having tons of natural light. This is why we made sure to pay extra close attention to the windows and doors so this space would be bright and airy.

We used Andersen 200 Series Tilt-Wash double-hung windows along the walls and Andersen 200 Series PS Patio Doors, 2 Panel that open up to the deck.

The floors we decided on are a beautiful laminate/engineered wood in Guadalupe Peak. These floors give the space a lovely, traditional feel. This room came together quite nicely and will be an excellent spot to read, work, or unwind.
